


walker has been adopted! Yay!!

Ann (GA) (in front) went with her foster brother to the blood bank! Did you know there are dog blood banks and your dog could be a blood donor? GSPs frequently have universal donor blood like Ann's foster brother! Ann said it was an interesting trip, but she was mostly in it for the snacks! The ladies at the blood bank had ALL the good snacks. There are many benefits to being a canine blood donor. Of course, the biggest one is being a potential lifesaving donor! But most blood banks will do blood work for free including heartworm tests and blood typing.



So if your dog ever has an emergency, you will know their blood type and some offer incentive programs for completing a certain amount of donations like a credit to your vet that you can use for veterinary expenses or even priority for blood transfusions if they ever need one. Most blood banks have weight and age restrictions. Many universities that have veterinary science programs have canine blood donor programs and there are some standalone blood banks as well. If you are interested, we encourage you to do some research about canine blood donation in your area!



A vet student found him, had him evaluated then contacted us. He is heartworm negative, a bit skinny, and was given meds for hookworms. He is a sweet boy, friendly with people and dogs, not aggressive towards cats but is very skittish. He's polite during feeding time and doesn't eat until everyone's bowl is filled. We do not know what he went through in his life but we're sure it was not easy being left behind. But his bad luck has changed and he has an amazing foster mom – our very experienced and dedicated volunteer Beth (thank you Beth)! Also, a very big thank you Marisela for saving Bruno and contacting us and also helping to transport him. And thank you Glen for taking the middle leg of the transport on short notice. Bruno is one lucky guy and his fabulous journey has just begun.



Calhoun (SC) recently had his neuter surgery. His foster mom Christie said, "We are still working on his play and manners. I think he must have had a rough start and just really doesn't know how to play. He loves to snuggle and loves to hug and despite his size is a very gentle hugger. 



The small indentation on his head appears to be muscle only, but he will be going to a specialist soon for a consult just to make sure. The bigger news is that he's coming out of his shell! His foster mom said,

“Diesel is fitting in so well with our pack. There have not been any acceptance issues with any of them. Diesel is a little shy, but is slowly starting to initiate or engage in playing. He likes water and playing with sticks. He is a great eater (no aggression), but doesn't eat fast at all. He has a precious little 'talking grumble' when he is excited to see you. He has stayed home with the other dogs while I'm away with no issues. He has not bothered anything in the house.” Diesel has about three more weeks in foster care and then will be searching for his forever home.



Dolly (AL) (8 years young), had her vet visit and sadly, she is heartworm positive. She has been vaccinated and is spayed so she just needs to heal from the heartworms (4 months) then she'll be ready for adoption. She is full of energy and LOVES to play with other dogs. Her foster mom Robyn says she is a Velcro GSP and has no special awareness LOL! She's also great with kids. Dolly is working on some manners – she's tall enough to counter surf successfully. Poor guy just can't get a break. Stay strong Dudley – once you're done with your treatment you can search for your forever home.


The wound on Eli's arm is almost closed up; once it's healed, Eli will be ready for adoption and he'll be posted on our website (and social media).

He's enjoying indoor living and the calluses are already much better. His paws sometimes bleed and he moves slowly with an obvious limp, but he's gaining strength already after 3 days in rescue. He's having trouble with stairs and his foster parents have to carry him down. He was clearly starved so he's enjoying many meals throughout the day and is already putting on weight. His bloodwork came back showing some liver issues so he's on medication. But despite his troubles, his foster mom says he is a happy guy and very appreciative of their efforts.

Gator (NC) our blind boy, is adjusting well to his new environment. He went to the vet and got lots of love from the staff. His foster dad Ray said,

"To be blind, he gets around very well and is definitely not afraid to explore new places. I can tell he is feeling better because he is starting to be more active and play. He loves playing fetch with his new squeaky ball in the house. He gets so excited when he finds the ball. He has also started to run a bit ... well for him it's more like a fast walk/hop but for sure he has more spring in his step. He does like to be near people and whines a lot if he can hear you but you are not in the same room. Sometime I put him in our sunroom just off the kitchen with doors closed and he will try to escape. He is quite clever (we call him Houdini) because he often can figure out how to open the double pocket doors in the sunroom despite having furniture in front of the doors." Gator is sadly heartworm positive so will be in rescue for a few more months before he can look for his forever home.



Gunther (AL - white), loves to play with his foster sister Arya! They had a good tug-of-war game over the weekend. Gunther received his 2nd hookworm treatment last week and he'll be retested this week (and neutered). His temporary foster mom says he's a pro at taking his medicines and vitamins (for his anemia). Good boy Gunther! Gus (SC) is new to rescue. Gus was a stray in NC and his family never came for him and we were contacted. Seems Gus likes to impersonate a fire truck LOL. His foster mom Amee said, "Gus is such a cuddle bug! He's always happy and does the cutest tap dance with his front paws when he gets excited. He's also quite the talker. Even though he wasn't neutered he is very easy going around our senior male GSP. He adores him and follows him everywhere. I think they'll be best buds in no time! We are still working on his excitement with our kitties, though."

He has lost a good amount of his excessive weight simply with all the running and playing. He has started getting through the night in his crate without whining. He has learned to respect a leash, but still needs a great deal on consistent work to get him 100%. He has almost 100% got "sit" on command, even during play. He is great with kids, horses, and lambs. However, would love to terrorize a cat or devour a chicken lol. He is okay with smaller dogs, but needs constant supervision so he doesn't play too rough with them. He is respectful of fences and is very passive when other dogs let him know they have had enough of him being in their faces. He just rolls over on the ground and puts his paws up. He is a sweet boy, who doesn't know his size, but is willing to learn and eager to be your best friend. Also, his love for running and his pool are excessive lol "

Luna (NC) is six years old. Her foster mom Jessica says she is one AWESOME dog. She's very polite and knows her basic obedience commands. She walks great on a gentle leader and has great recall, gets along great with all bigger dogs but due to her high prey drive it's best cats and smaller dogs aren't in the home. She is OBSESSED with squirrels. She is super eager to please, loves to snuggle and is super trainable. She loves baths and even does well when it is time to have those dreaded nail trims.



Millie (FL) has made it to her foster home. Thank you Susan for pulling Millie, letting her stay overnight and taking her to meet her foster mom, Allyson. Millie is healing from a double ACL surgery and is also starting her heartworm treatment. It's a rough start, but she is in excellent hands with her foster mom Allyson and her family. “She is loving life right now. Slept the whole way home. Enjoyed some treats and dinner, went into her kennel with a treat trail and a bone with peanut butter, now is loving the comfy beds, but really the comfy bed in her kennel. Nash (AL) had his skin biopsy and the vet is leaning more towards Cicatrical Alopecia. This condition can be caused by parasites or bacterial infections and Nash did have ringworms and a bacterial infection when he arrived in rescue. There really isn't anything that can be done for this condition so his foster mom Cheyenne continues to use coconut oil, fish oil, and herbal treatment. But it doesn't slow down Nash and he is still so laid-back, food-motivated and loving. Thank you Cheyenne and Joshua for all you're doing for Nash!

“Opal is good with other dogs but plays hard. She doesn't care about cats. Walks well on the leash. Is invisible fence trained and Lord knows I am working on come here. Lol. She is not so clunky, she will not knock people over and is really a sweet girl.”



Paleo (GA) 3 yo, has been doing so well! His foster mom Izzy said, “He is a ball of energy and is always a happy boy! He is finishing his Doxy for heartworm and then a month after that he will get his first shot for heartworm treatment. He is learning how to walk on a leash. He did great in a store (he had never been anywhere other than his foster home and a kennel before). He does scare easily but is getting better. He is still a puppy when he plays with his Great Dane foster brother. He isn't nervous anymore and can walk well on a leash. He's great with all other dogs and kids, loves to cuddle but is still a little timid of loud noises he doesn't expect. He's kennel trained, neutered and microchipped already. We love him so much and can't wait until he is the healthiest he can be (about 3 more months)! Thank you Izzy – fostering a heartworm positive dog can be challenging!

Peaches (FL) had her vet visit and she is 11 years young, now vaccinated and only 39 lbs (her foster mom is working on that one). She does have a broken canine tooth and molar we need to watch, but she is heartworm negative (happy dance). They removed about a half inch of toenails, which she wasn't happy about. Her foster mom says she appears both hearing and vision impaired, until you say "cookie".



Ruff (TN) has really settled into foster care and is counting down the days until exercise restriction is over due to his heartworm treatment. From his foster mom, Joy, "Even our vet thinks he is a great little dog. He has been through lots of changes yet is still so trusting and loving in new situations with new people and new animals."



Trixie (FL) one of our hospice foster dogs, is living the good life with her foster mom Bonnie. The puppies she lives with are growing fast and are still annoying to her, but she knows how to avoid them. She is a wiggler when happy, but still has her anxious moments (we think in her previous life she was punished severely). Thank you Bonnie for all you do for Trixie!



Taffy (NC) is only 3 years old but we've determined had a very difficult past and was no doubt abused. Our wonderful volunteer Marty at Kanupp Kennels did Taffy's assessment when she entered rescue a few weeks ago and found abuse marks on her which explains her fear-aggression towards men. But after only a couple weeks with Marty, Taffy/Trouble has allowed a man to rub her belly which is a HUGE step in her recovery. She is trusting people more and more each day thanks to the great work Marty and his staff has done – it's truly remarkable! Trouble still has a long way to go but she is making progress and we're very proud of her. THANK YOU Marty (and your staff)!



Umbra (NC), solid black, is now with her new foster mom Vicki and is doing great. No dog aggression and not afraid of anything! Vicki said, .

"She came in immediately and acted like she lived there her whole life. She is identical to Alum Quin's personality without the aggression and anxiety, she plays tough and growls and is mouthy but it's 100% play not fear or aggression."

Vicki is training her on a Garmin collar – beep only with treat rewards, since she has a little jumping/climbing habit, and she is responding very well. Vicki says she is very serious when given a command so has probably had prior training. Considering she came to rescue emaciated, she does not go after her foster canine siblings' food and is very gentle when taking treats – not what one would think for a starving dog (she does a little counter surfing though). Thank you Vicki for giving Umbra more training before she can look for her forever home.



Willow (SC), 6 years old, is a Velcro dog (LOL – she's a GSP so of course she is). Her foster dad Darrin said,

"She enjoys her own space, but isn't bothered by our smaller dog. She still growls at times to our other GSP, but he respects her area. We scheduled a doggy play date and that didn't go as planned. They were younger dogs and constantly in her face. She was not a fan. She is a grazer with food, but a sloppy drinker. Haha. She loves the couch, and does not do well in a kennel. She does excellent in the house, even if we have to leave. Still working on basic commands and leash walking. She is a snuggle GSP. Lately she has been going crazy when we go outside, I think she is excited."
